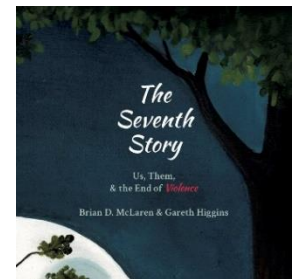

Us, Them, and the End of Violence: A Lenten Journey

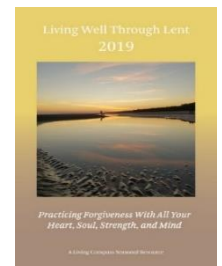

Practicing Forgiveness with All Your Heart, Soul, Strength, and Mind.

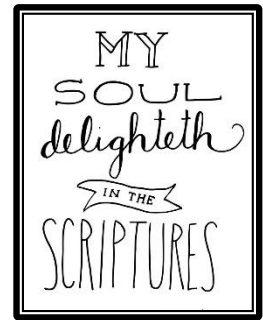

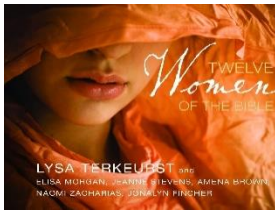
Bible Study -Pericopes - NO CLASS Thursday, March 14

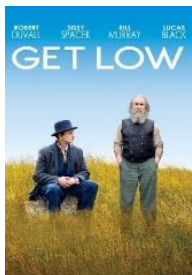
What have we accomplished since the fund was established?
