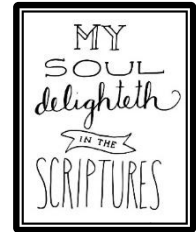

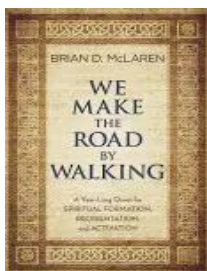

***This represents the number of beneficiaries that live within a one-kilometer radius of the project. More typically, 3-4 times that number of beneficiaries will be using the project regularly.*

In addition to providing safe, clean water to thousands of people, our wells will significantly reduce the time women and children spend collecting water. This means that the women will have more time to care for their families and engage in income-generating activities. Children will have more time to go to school and water related diseases will be a thing of the past.
